

Prohibitory Statute

Mr Chapman asked and obtained leave to introduce a bill entitled an act to incorporate the city of Steilacoom which was referred to Committee on Corporations

Mr Hall of committee on corporations reported back House bill 26 entitled an act to incorporate the city of Steilacoom.

Mr Hall moved to amend so that the council men should receive pay for their services after the city should contain three thousand inhabitants which was agreed to.

On motion of Mr. Brown the rules were suspended and the bill passed
